Guelph Potter's Guild – Meeting Minutes Date: Wednesday, June 24th, 2015; 7:00pm

Committee Updates:

1. Membership:

- a. Update on membership status: still available to sign up as a member during open studio times; 12 paid members so far.
- b. Need to add onto membership application that in order to view Member's Section (private viewing) on website, a member needs a gmail account;
- c. Correction: PSH discount of 5% for individuals does not apply; 30% group order discount still applies.
- d. Membership card: gPg logo created; going to go ahead with printing cards;
- e. Tracking sheets: Volunteer time tracking record and updated Open Studio sign in/sign out sheets; update the binder with training schedules once there has been a chance to discuss with technical team.
- f. Member technical training sessions:
 - DO IT NOW: keep diligent about cleaning (okay to claim volunteer time when cleaning, meanwhile running open studio); coordinate a mass clean up effort once classes are done;
 - ii. Pugging clay step one for technical training
 - iii. Screening glazes and slip maintenance step two
 - iv. Empty kiln step three
 - v. Loading kiln (bisque fire) step four
 - vi. Loading kiln (glaze fire) step five
 - vii. Make slips step six (workshop?)
 - viii. Make/maintain glazes step seven

2. Intra-studio community:

- a. Summer hours for Open Studio: open Saturday 12-4 p.m. and Wednesday; Sunday pending interest/demand for more time
- b. Studio cleanup event: August 29 (AM) for a deep cleaning with individual members signing up for volunteer hours throughout summer to keep up maintenance cleaning.

3. Communications Team:

- a. Doodle/Monkey poll nearly ready and will be sent to general interest email list to gather feedback on website effectives, ease of use, topics, sections, etc.
- b. Require update on: social media, quarterly newsletter at next meeting, generic grant letter/application ideas.

4. New Site Team:

- a. Letter written on behalf of GPG has been sent to the City;
- b. Update on site meetings:
 - i. No new updates since last meeting;

- ii. Requirements for space: City needs to own the space (current need, not mandatory requirement), needs to be centralized, accessible, accommodating for a messy craft, parking.
- c. Fence and main gate lock situation:
 - i. Only one entry/exit that is not accessible
 - ii. Problematic key situation to get through walkway gate (2 keys)
 - iii. Rob (Rod?) Manager of Operations is aware of the key situation and our search of new studio space; request made for additional main gate and walkway keys (Nancy).

5. Exhibition Team:

- a. GPG has a mailing address! As part of the membership with the Guelph Art's Council.
- b. No promising grants available at the moment; strong interest in the Art's Council to procure grants related to youth (will tie nicely with GPG's aim to provide a service to youth, self-esteem/mental health initiatives).
- c. 2016 Guelph Potter's Market GPG could offer a demonstration table, competition challenges (e.g. how tall can you go); if we were to have a table at professional shows, we would need to self-jury pieces to be able to ask professional prices. By providing a demo and challenge event, in addition to a juried GPG table, we would still be able to engage all of our members (shows don't always need to be about selling);
- d. 2016 Spring Cheep-Cheep Sale for the whole Guild can sell at, no restrictions on prices, no jury (similar to Exhibition Show at Christmas);
- e. Joanne Pullock McDonald Stewart Art Centre (closed until renos are done; centre to be called Art Gallery of Guelph) has a shop we might be able to display and possibly sell through.
- f. Crafts 4 U (Edinburgh St.) shop as another place to sell; lady who runs this shop also coordinates craft shows in Guelph for the Christmas season.
- g. Masterpiece Gallery (Scheiz, Fife Rd.) shop as another local place

New Business:

Mug Fest – early fall/late summer; invite local coffee and tea shops to showcase their brews, while the GPG sells mugs as the tasting vessels (akin to the idea of Harvest Bowls). This would be a fundraising initiative for the GPG.

When: September 26th or 19th (during Jazz Festival, Lisa to contact); or Christmas Sale (create a Guild specific area); Guelph Arts Council – HATCH Program (pop-up shops, Hilary to contact)

Where: City Hall Atrium or Courtyard area; unknown

What/How:

- a. Sell mugs get a beverage (or coupon for discounted beverage on next visit to vendor).
- b. Guild has a stand somewhere with large thermos vats with coffees, hot water, different teas, and sell mugs.

- c. Ask vendors to donate beverages
- d. Mug displays in various coffee shops a month before Christmas sale.
- e. Different price points for mugs based on quality and complexity.
- f. Mug-making: members would play for the clay themselves (partial or full bag, pending on member's desired productivity for the cause); make the mugs, and then donate what was made; build in a workshop and promote general interest email list people to come out and join in on the fun, and also sign up as a member of the Guild
 - a. Wednesday August 19th 7-8:30pm Handle Workshop (Eleanor)
 - b. Require 3-4 leather hard mugs to participate in workshop
